When **searching** for subs from a particular prime, you can also search for subs from the divisions of a larger organization by checking the "Include Children" box.

In this case, "children" does not mean components of a Program Project Grant (PPG).

Examples:

Entering Department of Defense in the Prime Sponsor text box will pull up records from all agencies under that entity. (e.g. Office of Naval Research, Army Research Office, etc.)

Entering Department of Health and Human Services will show results from NIH, Food and Drug Administration, National Cancer Institute, etc.
